Valuing Climate Change Impacts on Coral Reef Ecosystem Services

Hawaiian coral reefs are of great ecological, cultural, and economic value, but they face serious threats including overfishing and pollution as well as larger-scale changes due to climate change. Project Leader Kirsten Oleson will discuss her research developing modeling tools to predict future effects of reef management choices, and how these tools can be used by resource managers and community groups to help ensure that reef function is preserved for multiple uses.
